Principal's Message


The Southwest High School (SHS) Student Support Team (SST) is committed to fostering a safe and positive school climate focused on student college and career readiness. The Southwest High School's Counseling Department is a critical component to our SST and is aligned with the American School Counselor Association (ASCA) national standards for professional school counseling. This year's SPARC, highlights the student support services and programs provided to all students for career and college preparation necessary for post-secondary success. Furthermore, the SPARC report is incorporated into our Southwest High School Single Plan for Student Achievement. In keeping with our school plan, these programs and services promote academic excellence, community building, and college and career preparation needed to succeed in the 21st century. As a result, two key career and college readiness student outcomes we aim to improve for the 2014-15 school year are: (1) Improve our academic rigor by increasing the number of students enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors courses (2) Improve employability skills by increasing the number of students completing Career Technical Education Pathway and/or Regional Occupation Program (ROP) certificates.

Career and College Readiness Student Outcomes

The Southwest High School Student Support Team focuses on implementing support services which prepare all our students with the 21st Century Skills necessary for college and career success. Measuring the impact of our services through student outcomes data provides our SST the information necessary to revise and improve our support programs and services to benefit all students.


Career Readiness

Southwest Career Readiness Graph - All Freshman students created a California Career Locker account during classroom career lessons. Members of the SST contributed their efforts to promote college and career planning by holding follow-up individual counseling sessions with students and families. 
College Readiness

Southwest College Readiness Graph - Members of the SST, specifically, counselors, teach and lead student groups to provide guidance and advisement on student college and career planning. SHS Counselors led classroom lessons and met individually with students and parents in grades 9–12. Southwest Academies Graph - The Southwest Visual and Performing Arts Academy (SAVAPA) and the Southwest Academy for Career in Health Science (SACHS) are two SHS academies where students explore and expand their creative talents and career interests. Members of the SST contributed in the application process and placement of students. This graph illustrates the number of SHS students enrolled in an academy.
